Team Kyle A huge thank you to Team Kyle, who have raised a phenomenal £5,200 for Crosshouse Children's Fund. This generous donation has helped to fund a specialist mobile sensory unit for young patients at Crosshouse Hospital.

Over the past few years, Kyle has spent a considerable amount of time as an inpatient at Crosshouse in Ward 1B, and is well known by all of the staff there.

"During all of these long stays, I decided that when Kyle was home and hopefully in a better state of health, we would give something back as a family. The new mobile sensory unit includes features like a projector, fibre optic lights and a play mat. The unit can be wheeled between wards, and helps to calm and comfort children, particularly those with sensory processing problems.

"The equipment will hopefully be a comfort to the many children who spend time on the ward, especially to children who have additional needs and spend long periods in hospital."
