Key Responsibilities Fundraising

Our community fundraising income has grown significantly for the past two years, and we are excited to grow the Crosshouse Children's Fund team to make an even bigger impact.

Reporting to the Fundraising Manager, you will have the opportunity to work on all aspects of fundraising with the charity, including:

Community and Supporter-Led Fundraising

- Support and motivate our fundraisers with materials, guidance and motivation for supporter lead challenges and activities including sponsored walks, bake sales, lunches, golf days, etc.
- Research and identify local community events to promote our charity
- Support our collection can service, and grow community collection opportunities
- Represent the charity at events, talks and networking opportunities
- Grow the charity's income by engaging with local community partners such as supermarkets and other organisations

Education and Youth

- Support and develop our Ted-ucation school and youth group visits
- Assist with education and youth group fundraising, including YPI groups

Key Responsibilities Fundraising Events

- Work with the Fundraising Manager on the development of Crosshouse Children's Fund events
- Support and develop established charity events, including our Christmas Fair and Around Arran in 30 Days challenge
- Work closely with our volunteers and wider team to deliver the events safely and with a strong ROI
- Support people who are taking part in third party events for Crosshouse Children's Fund, such as the Kiltwalk and Great Scottish Run
- Provide 'on the day' assistance at our own and third party events to ensure our supporters and motivated, engaged and encouraged
- Work with the Fundraising Manager to implement a plan for event follow up
- Work the Fundraising Manager and Marketing team on the production of materials and supporter stories



Key Responsibilities Hospital Events

You will also work closely with the Charity Impact Team to create special moments for the young patients, families and NHS staff that the charity supports. Together with the team, you will:

- Help support the delivery of play, events, activities and decorations for the children and families on the wards, in line with key dates, annual holidays and seasonal events including Valentine's Day, Easter, Halloween and Christmas.
- Collaborate with the NHSAAA Play Team to facilitate the delivery of scheduled entertainers and one-off visits.
- Organise and deliver staff appreciation gifts and activities on key
 awareness days
- Provide administrative support for all events and activities, ensuring compliance with NHS regulations.

Additional Responsibilities

- Provide support for the wider Glasgow Children's Hospital Charity group, including attending events at our other sites
- To maintain and develop good working relationships with other members of the wider organisation, volunteers and NHS staff.
- To attend events and activities, and represent the Charity, many of which may take place in the evening or at weekends
- Any other relevant duties as may be required by the SMT.
